He has more than three decades of experience in civil rights advocacy, and has litigated many cases for education, employment, voting rights, housing, police misconduct, capital punishment and other civil rights in trial, appellate courts, and in the US Supreme Court. He has served Director-Counsel and President of the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund, Inc. and on the Obama Transition Team after the 2008 election, as team leader for the Civil Rights Division of the Justice Department.
